This process occurs in a controlled indoor environment, producing a smooth, shiny finish ideal for applications requiring precision and aesthetics. Hot-dip galvanized (HDG) cable trays are produced by immersing steel in molten zinc at high temperatures (around 450°C). This creates a thicker, rougher coating that forms metallurgical zinc-iron layers bonded to the steel, providing robust protection against corrosion.

Coating Thickness and Corrosion Resistance

- EG coatings are typically 5–30 microns thick, offering moderate corrosion resistance suitable for indoor or mild environments.
- HDG coatings range from 45–120 microns, providing excellent corrosion resistance in harsh, outdoor, or industrial environments, including marine or humid conditions. The thicker HDG layer ensures long-term durability and reduces maintenance needs, while EG coatings may require periodic inspection and touch-ups in corrosive settings.
