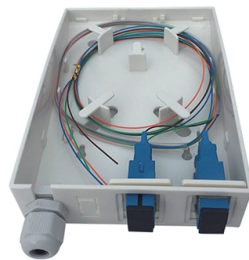


Distance between the suspended platform and the electrical distribution box



Article Overview

A minimum clearance of 3 feet (36 inches) in front of electrical equipment is required, with at least 30 inches on the sides, to ensure safe operation and maintenance when using a suspended platform.

Recommended Clearances

Front Clearance: The National Electrical Code (NEC) and industry standards require a minimum of 3 feet (36 inches) of unobstructed space in front of electrical panels, distribution boxes, or switchgear to allow safe access for inspection, maintenance, and emergency operations . This ensures that doors can open at least 90 degrees and personnel can maneuver tools safely. **Side Clearance:** A minimum of 30 inches is required from the sides of electrical equipment, or at least the width of the equipment itself if greater, to prevent accidental contact with live parts . **Height Clearance:** Adequate headroom must be maintained above the equipment, typically extending from the floor to 6 feet above the equipment or to the structural ceiling, whichever is lower . This ensures that suspended platforms do not interfere with overhead components or obstruct ventilation.
