

Does the core switch need an expansion card

A core switch does not inherently require an expansion card, but modular expansion cards are used to increase port capacity or add functionality if needed.

Core Switch Configurations

Core switches come in two main types: fixed-configuration and modular. Fixed-configuration switches have a set number of ports and features that cannot be upgraded, so they operate without expansion cards. Modular core switches, on the other hand, allow for flexible expansion through line cards or modules, which can increase port density, add higher-speed interfaces, or provide additional features like advanced routing or redundancy .

When Expansion Cards Are Useful

Expansion cards are optional and primarily used when:

- The network requires more ports than the base chassis provides.
- Higher-speed interfaces (e.g., 40G or 100G) are needed.
- Additional redundancy or specialized features are desired.
- The network is expected to scale in the future, and modular flexibility is preferred .

If the existing core switch already meets the network's port and performance requirements, expansion cards are not necessary....
