Understanding Fiber Optic Pigtails

A fiber optic pigtail is a short length of optical fiber with a factory-terminated connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other. The connector end is polished and tested for low insertion loss and high return loss, while the bare end is designed for fusion or mechanical splicing to the main fiber cable in the field. Pigtails are commonly used in optical distribution frames, terminal boxes, or patch panels where bulk fiber cables need reliable termination.

Cold Connectors (Mechanical/SC Fast Connectors)

A cold connector, also called a mechanical splice or fast connector, allows field termination without a fusion splicer. It aligns the bare fiber with a short fiber stub inside the connector using index-matching gel or mechanical clamping, enabling optical signal transmission. SC/APC cold connectors, with an 8-degree angled polish, provide high return loss (≥ 60 dB), making them suitable for GPON, EPON, and CATV networks, while SC/UPC connectors offer slightly lower return loss (≥ 50 dB).
