

Fixed Spacing of Vertical Sections of Cable Trays



Article Overview

Vertical cable trays should generally be supported at intervals of 1.5 to 2 meters, with additional strain relief for long runs.

Standard Support Intervals

For vertical cable tray installations, supports should be fixed to the building structure at intervals preferably less than 2 meters to maintain stability and prevent sagging or stress on the cables. In practice, many installations secure cables at the top and then at every 1.5 meters along the vertical run. This spacing ensures that the tray remains structurally sound and that cables are properly restrained.

Considerations for Long Vertical Runs

- **Strain Relief Sections:** For vertical runs exceeding 32 meters, strain relief sections should be incorporated. This typically involves offsetting the cable by at least 2 cable diameters at each strain relief point.
- **Excessive Runs:** For runs over 100 meters, additional measures such as short horizontal sections (at least 1 meter) are recommended to relieve tension and prevent cable damage.
