Single-mode fiber (SMF) supports distances up to 40-100+ kilometers for standard applications, while multimode fiber (MMF) is typically limited to 300 meters to 2 kilometers. The actual distance depends on factors including fiber type, wavelength, network equipment, and signal. The maximum distance for single mode fiber optic cable can extend up to several hundred kilometers, making it ideal for long distance data transmission. One type of single mode fiber is known as “G. 652,” which is commonly used in telecommunications networks. Key single mode distance specifications: For example, a fiber optic cable with a distance of 1km supports a bandwidth of 500MHz, while a fiber optic cable with a distance of 2km can only support a bandwidth of 250MHz. There are three main reasons for this: First, high-bandwidth signals are more susceptible to chromatic dispersion than. In the design of any network—whether a home Wi-Fi setup, an office backbone, or a global telecom infrastructure—the maximum length of network cables is a make-or-break factor. Exceeding a cable's length limit leads to signal attenuation (loss), reduced bandwidth, and unreliable connectivity. Single-mode. That's where range comes in.
