Rule of thumb: Total loss = Splitter loss + Cable loss. Avoid cascading too many splitters—most setups max out at 2-3 levels to prevent unusable signal levels.

Fiber-optic splitter

Balanced (2xN) splitters consists of 2 input fibers and N output fibers which divide the power of the optical signal proportionally. They are mainly used for non-simultaneous redundancy.

Fiber To The Home Network Design

Splitters come in binary ratios (2, 4, 8, 16, 32) and can be cascaded in any sequence as long as the multiplied split ratios are no more than 32, e.g. 2+16, 4+8, 2+4+4, etc.
