

How to connect a network cable from the fiber distribution box

Cleave the Fiber Use a precision fiber cleaver to cut the fiber ends at a 90-degree angle. This ensures a clean surface for splicing or connector attachment, which is critical for minimizing signal loss . 4. Splice or Terminate the Fiber

- Fusion Splicing: Join the incoming fiber to a pigtail fiber using a fusion splicer. This creates a permanent, low-loss connection .
- Mechanical Splicing or Connectorization: If using connectors (SC, LC, ST, FC), attach the connector to the fiber end according to the manufacturer's instructions. Ensure proper alignment and locking to maintain signal integrity . 5. Connect to Network Equipment Insert the terminated fiber connector into the corresponding port on you...
