

How to run exposed wires from a distribution box

Exposed wires in a distribution box must be properly insulated, secured, and protected using conduits, raceways, or cable management systems to ensure safety and compliance with electrical codes.

Safety First

Before handling any wiring, turn off the main power supply to the distribution box to prevent electric shock. Always use insulated tools and wear protective gloves when working inside the panel. Ensure that the distribution box is installed in a dry, accessible location with proper ventilation and at a safe height, typically around 1.5 meters from the floor .

Securing and Protecting Wires

- **Use Conduits or Raceways:** Exposed wires, especially nonmetallic-sheathed (NM) cables like Romex, must be mechanically protected where they are susceptible to physical damage. This can be achieved by running wires through PVC or metal conduits, surface raceways, or guard strips .
- **Support and Spacing:** Secure wires at intervals not exceeding 4.5 feet and within 12 inches of every entry point into the distribution box . This prevents sagging and reduces strain on connections.
- **Cable Management:** Use DIN rails, terminal blocks, or cable ties to organize wires neatly inside the box. Keep phase, neutral, and ground wires separated and avoid crossing wires unnecessarily
