Leased lines are full fibre connections, meaning they use fibre optic cables end-to-end from the ISP directly to the business premises.

Leased lines operate over fibre optic cables, also referred to as optical fiber, providing a dedicated, uncontended connection that is not shared with other users . Unlike standard fibre broadband, which may share bandwidth among multiple users in an area, leased lines offer a 1:1 contention ratio, ensuring consistent and reliable speeds at all times . This makes them ideal for businesses that require symmetrical upload and download speeds, low latency, and high reliability .

Key Characteristics of Leased Lines

- **Dedicated Bandwidth:** The connection is reserved exclusively for the subscribing business, unlike shared fibre broadband where speeds can fluctuate during peak usage .
- **Symmetrical Speeds:** Leased lines provide identical upload and download speeds, which is crucial for activities like video conferencing, cloud services, and large file transfers .
- **Service Level Agreements (SLAs):** Most leased line contracts include SLAs guaranteeing uptime, response times, and technical support .
- **End-to-End Fibre:** The fibre optic cable runs directly from the ISP to the business premises, bypassing public internet infrastructure until it reaches the provider's network, reducing latency and potential congestion
