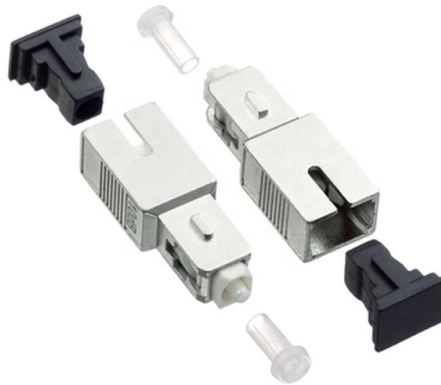


Is there fiber optic cable inside the network panel

How Fiber Is Managed

Inside the network panel, fiber cables are routed carefully to prevent bending beyond manufacturer specifications, which could cause signal loss or microfractures. The panel may include splice trays for fusion splicing or direct termination points for pre-terminated fiber cables. Short fiber patch cables, also called jumpers, connect the panel to switches, transceivers, or servers, enabling flexible and reliable network connections
