

Neutral wire in multi-circuit distribution box



Overview

Multi-wire circuits use two hot wires and one neutral wire. A distribution box is a low-voltage electrical enclosure that receives incoming power and distributes it safely to multiple outgoing circuits through protective and switching devices such as MCBs, RCDs, RCBOs, fuses, isolators, busbars, neutral bars, earth bars, and surge protective devices. The neutral wire is a current-carrying conductor that provides the pathway for the current to return to the transformer after passing. A shared neutral represents an efficient wiring configuration where a single neutral wire serves as the common return path for two separate 120-volt circuits in a Multi-Wire Branch Circuit (MWBC). This technique is common in residential construction, particularly for high-use areas like kitchens. If neutral is bonded to ground in the subpanel, return current from the neutral conductor may travel not only on the neutral wire but also on any bonded ground wires and metal parts of the main and subpanel's enclosure. This parallel path for current can lead to: Shock Hazards: Metal parts bonded.
