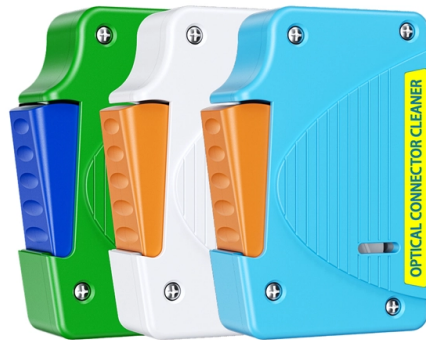

Cable Material Costs: Fiber optic cables vary widely in price based on type and strand count. Single-mode fiber is generally cheaper than multi-mode, with wholesale prices ranging from \$0.09 to \$1.52 per foot, and retail prices from \$1 to \$6 per foot. High-count backbone cables (e.g., 288 strands) can cost \$6 per foot or more, while simple FTTH drop cables may be as low as \$0.13 per foot . **Aerial Installation Costs:** Installing fiber on existing power poles is significantly cheaper than building new poles. Using ADSS (All-Dielectric Self-Supporting) cables, make-ready costs per pole range from \$800 to \$4,500, and the cable plus hardware installation costs range from \$1.50 to \$8 per meter (\$0.46-\$2.44 per foot) depending on terrain and complexity . SkyWrap, a retro-fit solution for attaching fiber to overhead lines, offers fast deployment with minimal additional load and can reduce labor and equipment costs . **Comparison to New Pole Construction:** Building new telecom poles is far more expensive, with pole-specific costs ranging from \$15,000 to \$175,000 per kilometer, excluding cable and labor . Leveraging existing power poles reduces costs by 60-85% and avoids land acquisition and extensive permitting. **Labor and Permits:** Labor rates for fiber installation typically range from \$50 to \$150 per hour, depending on region and project complexity. Permits and coordination with utility companies are required for pole attachments, which can add to project timelines and costs
