

Removal of busbar cable trays



Article Overview

Busbar cable trays should be removed following strict isolation, mechanical support, and stepwise disassembly procedures to ensure safety and prevent equipment damage.

Safety and Preparation

Before any removal, ensure complete electrical isolation of the busbar system and verify it is dead using appropriate testing equipment. All personnel must wear personal protective equipment (PPE), including gloves, safety glasses, and insulated tools, in accordance with site safety regulations. Conduct a risk assessment and toolbox talk to brief all operatives on the removal procedure and hazards involved .

Stepwise Removal Procedure

- **Inspect Busbar Sections:** Check for any visible damage or loose components. Remove protective end caps if present, but leave them in place during transport to prevent conductor damage .
- **Remove Tap-Off Units and Covers:** For each tap-off position, remove the IP54 cover by opening the door with the provided key and releasing the clamping mechanisms using the 6mm T-bar. Carefully extract the tap-off box, ensuring the earth contact and actuator are properly disengaged .
- **Support and Lift Busbar Sections:** Use mechanical lifting devices such as Geni Lifts, forklifts, or hoists for sections exceeding 25 kg. Lift each section by the main body, not by the ends or conductors, to avoid bending or damage .
- **Disconnect from Mounting Brackets:** Loosen and remove all ceiling or wall mounting brackets. Ensure the busbar is fully supported during this process to prevent sudde...
