

Should the wiring in the distribution box be overhead

Wiring inside a distribution box is generally not installed overhead; proper routing through conduits or cable entries is recommended for safety and compliance.

Wiring Inside the Distribution Box

Distribution boxes are designed to house circuit breakers, busbars, terminal blocks, and wiring in a safe, organized manner. The wiring should enter through designated cable entry points and be neatly routed along DIN rails or terminal blocks to prevent damage, maintain accessibility, and allow for maintenance. Overhead wiring inside the box is not standard practice because it can create stress on connections, increase the risk of insulation damage, and complicate troubleshooting.

Overhead vs. Underground Distribution Systems

Overhead distribution systems refer to power lines installed above ground on poles or towers, typically for delivering electricity from substations to transformers or local distribution points. While overhead lines are common for external distribution due to lower cost and easier maintenance, this concept does not apply to the internal wiring of a distribution box. Inside the box, wires should be routed through approved conduits or cable channels, not suspended overhead.
