

# Vertical installation spacing of cable trays



## Article Overview

For vertical cable tray installations, cables should be secured at the top and every 1.5 meters, with at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above trays for maintenance and installation access.

### Key Guidelines for Vertical Spacing

**Cable Securing:** In vertical runs, cables must be fastened to the tray's transverse members to prevent movement and maintain order. The recommended spacing for securing cables is every 1.5 meters along the vertical tray, ensuring stability and reducing mechanical stress on the conductors during installation and operation .

**Clearance Requirements:** The 2026 NEC update specifies a minimum of 12 inches of vertical clearance above cable trays to allow safe installation and maintenance access . This clearance also facilitates proper airflow, which is critical for heat dissipation and preventing overheating.

**Support Intervals:** Vertical trays should be supported according to the manufacturer's instructions and NEC 392.30(A). Standard trays typically require supports every 6 to 10 feet, while heavy-duty or long-span trays may allow up to 20 feet between supports. Unsupported spans, especially at transitions to equipment or other raceways, should not exceed 6 feet .

**Cable Ties and Fastening:** Use listed and approved cable ties suitable for cable tray applications. Avoid overtightening to prevent damage to cable jackets. For outdoor installations, UV-resistant ties are recommended to prevent degradation .

**Tray Fill and Separation:** Maintain proper fill rates—generally not exceeding 40% for power cables and 50% for control cables—to ensure adequate airflow. High-power and low-power cables shoul...
