

# What is the appropriate depth for cable tray supports

It is not arbitrary and must be selected based on the type and number of cables, as well as the expected mechanical load . **Standard Depth Ranges:** Common cable tray depths vary depending on the tray type:

- Ladder trays: Typically 4 to 9 inches deep, designed for heavy power cables and long spans, allowing maximum airflow and heat dissipation .
  - Ventilated trough trays: Usually 2 to 6 inches deep, suitable for control and instrumentation cables that require continuous support .
  - Wire mesh trays: Depths often range from 2 to 6 inches, providing flexibility for light to medium cable loads .
- Load and Span Considerations:** The depth of the tray affects its structural performance. Deeper trays can support heavier loads and longer spans, but increasing width may sometimes be more effective for airflow and cable management than simply increasing depth . Support spacing should also be considered: horizontal supports are typically spaced 1.5 to 3 meters apart, while vertical supports should be less than 2 meters apart for stability . **NEC Compliance:**...
