

Which module is triggering the optical port LOS alarm



Article Overview

An optical port LOS (Loss of Signal) alarm is typically triggered by the module that is not receiving an optical signal, often the transceiver (SFP/SFP+) or the upstream optical line terminal (OLT) port.

Understanding LOS Alarms

A Loss of Signal (LOS) alarm occurs when an optical module detects no incoming optical signal. This can be caused by:

- Fiber cuts or breaks along the link
- Disconnected or improperly seated transceivers
- Transmitter failure at the upstream module
- Severe signal degradation below the receiver sensitivity threshold (e.g., -28 dBm for GPON Class B+ modules) In OTN systems, LOS is classified at the OTU layer, indicating that the Optical Transport Unit cannot detect any valid optical signal, which may propagate alarms to higher layers .

Determining the Triggering Module

- Check the LOS Indicator on the Module: The module showing the LOS alarm is usually the one not receiving the optical signal. For example, if an ONU's LOS LED is blinking red, it indicates the ONU is not receiving light from the OLT .
- Inspect Fiber Connections: Verify that the fiber patch cords are intact, connectors are clean, and there are no severe bends or breaks. A faulty fiber can cause the LO...
